Beacons during August. Alex took a victory in gloriously warm sunny conditions ahead of clubmate **Ed Davies** with youngster Todd Langley-Tanner (Mercia) in third place. **Jacqui Loxam** took the women's honours with Jane Moore in second and **Hannah Owen**, who has been something of a revelation this year, in third. **Helen Owen** and **Rachel Butler** bagged age group wins as did the inspirational V70 Gordon Orme of Cardigan who finished 11th overall in a superb 70:31.

Overall, 45 runners took part and all were accounted for at the finish, with seemingly fewer thrills and spills than last year. This was two better last year with several first-timers, including a few friends of Alex who turned up and made a very decent go of things – testimony to the power of "word of mouth" it seems. Thanks to everyone who helped out with registration, marshalling, time-keeping, results and refreshments and to all who took part. Honestly folks, Cross Country should be very doable after this!

Penmaenpool Trail Race, Meirionnydd, 20th September 2014

Maldwyn's women recorded "one-two-three" clean sweep at this second running of the 8.9 mile Pen Trail Race. **Hannah Owen** took the laurels in a time of 1.15:14 with **Rachel Butler** second in 1.25:07 and **Jill Hillman** in third (1.37:07).

In the overall race, **Sean Clarke** was our first finisher in 6th place (1.07:01), a single slot ahead of **Paul Beeson** (1.09:33) with **Steve Orrells** in 19th and **Michelle Beeson** in 20th.

After the race Hannah said "I really enjoyed the course, especially the challenge of the loops up through the woods. The end stretch beside the estuary was the most challenging but it was a great race, beautiful scenery and really well organised". Indeed although it was by most standards a small turnout the feedback has been remarkably positive so here's hoping this newish event goes from strength to strength.

Lake Vyrnwy Half Marathon, 14th September 2014

Our local 13 miler attracted a fair contingent of Maldwyn Harriers thanks in part to a couple of late entries. You don't usually associate **Tim Davies** with flat, tarmac surfaces and indeed Tim has been somewhat sparing in his racing of late. Good, then, to see him return in a splendid 11th place and a fast time of 73:55. Our next Maldwyn accredited runner (although Haydn Jones finished 110th in 87:49) was **Rob Martin** who dipped under 90 minutes with 89:55. First of our women to finish was sprinter-turned-endurance runner, Loughborough University student **Catrin Thomas** who knocked a big chunk off her best with a 1.45:58 clocking. **Claire Abel** can lay claim to being Ms Consistency over the half marathon distance – 1.49:17 gave her yet another sub-1.50 clocking

- while **June Jones** and **Jacqui Lloyd** paced each other to 2.12:29 and 2.12:30 respectively and **Rachel Williams** also ran well to finish in 2.18:51.

TRACK AND FIELD

What better way to end this month's results round-up than with more eye-witness accounts from trackside and indeed on track from the **Travelling Harrier**, soon to be donning his galoshes and deer stalker (maybe his X-C spikes?) and reporting on our youngsters' cross-country activities. Take it away, Chris...

Cheshire League, Macclesfield, 7th September 20141

Another glorious sunny day and its back to Macclesfield for the 4th and final leg of this year's Cheshire League. Again, not as many made the trip as we would have liked. Shame, we had a fantastic day in the Cheshire sunshine.

I'm going to start with young **Harvey Gill** in the U11's. He epitomised what it's all about - get your name down and have a go. A little overawed on his debut Harvey showed no such reticence here. A battling 5th in the 75m, followed by a strong run in the 600m, in which he left plenty in his wake as he finished in 9th (2.18) in a large field. For good measure he also had a go at the soft javelin. Good man, Harvey, we could do with a few more like you.

U13's...**Dillon Gill** favours the 1500m and that was his chosen event for the afternoon. Despite a decent start Dillon became a little detached from the leading group, finding himself in 'no man's land' for much of the race. Effectively a solo run, 6^{th} in 5.18 was a tidy effort. **Oscar Crutchley** went for the 100m and the long jump. 100m is a little short for Oscar I think. He still did well – 6^{th} in 15.5. A good couple of jumps (and 1 very close no jump) saw Oscar 8^{th} with 3.38 in a large pool of athletes. I still reckon that with a bit of work Oscar can do really well at this event.

U15's...Maldwyn debutante **Bethan Davies** looks to be quite a prospect for next season. Eased into the 'A' race by Meg, Bethan ran a great bend and remained in contention right to the end, eventually settling for 3rd in 29.0. **Meg Davies** found herself pushed all the way in the 'B' race.

In a really exciting contest Meg ultimately emerged victorious in a PB time of 27.4. The pair then went head to head in the long jump. This time Bethan came out on top in the battle of the Harriers – 4th with 4.23 to Meg's 5th with a season's best 4.12. **Shannon Walker** has had a great season on the track. She has worked hard and her times have steadily improved. Shannon ran a really positive 800m, ending up 3rd of 13. A PB 2.38 was her reward for having a go.

U17's...**Chloe Evans** came to Macclesfield off the back of a hard week's training. That effort paid off as Chloe was the 1st lady home in a very competitive 3k. Chloe then entered the 800m. With 3k in her legs we adjusted our expectations accordingly. I felt 2.40 was on and, sure enough, 2.40.5 was delivered. A season's best in 5th place. **Huw Weaver** just went for a 200m blast. Another smashing effort from Huw as he came home 4th in 31.8, a mere 0.1 seconds off a season's best.

Seniors...Like Huw before him **Reece Moles** restricted himself to the 200m. In yet another exciting race Reece had to settle for 2nd in 24.7, tantalisingly 0.1 second away from a PB. Regular readers will doubtless recall that last time we came to Macclesfield **Martin Copus** left the skin from his knee on the track. This time he arrived with it ready skinned, the result of some enthusiastic fielding at cricket the previous day. Despite this Martin thought he'd probably be ok in the 1500m. 5th in a PB 5.01.5, Martin seemed happy enough. Also falling into the 'happy enough' category was yours truly with a 6 second PB in the 3k – albeit nearly a minute behind Chloe.

Just the relays to go, then. Bethan, Meg and Shannon all stepped up an age group to join Chloe in the U17's 4×100 . Victory was never very likely but 3^{rd} in 57.0 was certainly respectable.

U13's.. What a cracking run from **Kate Jerman**. In the leading group throughout Kate looked really strong all the way round. She eventually finished 6th - a few seconds outside the top three. A great advance on last season's performances.

Dillon Gill also produced a stand out performance. Never outside the top 3, Dillon was in determined mood coming through for a battling 2nd place. This could be an interesting competition as the season progresses. Admired by the coaches for his tenacity young **Amren Stephenson** kept working right to the end for his 30th place. This was a big step up in distance for him. Well done.

U15's.. **Kaya Saul** was our sole representative in this age group. Undaunted by the strapping on his leg Kaya put in a typically hard working performance. He made his way steadily through the field to finish 11th. Another good effort.

U17's.. **Chloe Evans** and **Margo Martin** complete the line up of Harriers at Oswestry. In a much larger field than usual both young ladies really grafted for top 10 places. Early leader Chloe had to settle for 5th at the end. We'll have to work on tactics Chloe. Margo's reward for some hard work in the autumn sunshine was 10th. I think Margo was happy to see the finish!

All in all some terrific performances, just a shame we were so few in number. **12th October at Packwood School is the next one**. It's a great course, come and have a go.
